OPERATIONS REPORT

December 10, 2014 - January 6, 2015

GREATER ALARM:

There were two greater alarm fires during this reporting period at the following locations:

- 3rd Alarm 241-243 Mississippi Street cross: Mariposa/19th St (12/25/14)
 0639 hours, 3-story, type 5, Multi-residential. There were no injuries. The cause of the fire is still under investigation. (AC Franklin)
- 2nd Alarm 1389 Underwood Avenue cross: Ingalls St/Jennings St (12/31/14) 1156 hours, 2-story, type 3, commercial building. There was some concern of the structural integrity of the roof at one point, but later determined it was not compromised. There were no injuries. The fire was accidental, cooking equipment failure. (AC Franklin)

Inclement Weather on 12/11/14:

(12/11/14) a high wind storm system brought heavy rain to the San Francisco Bay Area. There were sustained winds of 25-35 MPH with widespread gusts of up to 50 MPH. The City sustained several areas of flooding. There was a high surf advisory along the coast. The SFUSD closed several schools. The DOC was activated with partial activation of DPW, PUC, MTA, RPD and SFO.

Fire Response:

- The 10-1 Modified Response was in effect
- Dispatching on A4
- At the height, 20 building alarms were in queue
- Many calls for trees down, flooding, elevator rescues, electrical hazards
- Blown Transformers at: Larkin/Eddy and Grant/Sutter area

Treasure Island:

- Infrastructure and facilities: no major issues
- Landslide at Hillcrest Ct./Coventry Lane one lane blocked

Trees Down at:

- Portola/Laguna Honda all traffic to the Sunset blocked
- Junipero/Strafford
- Monterey/San Rafael

Flooding at:

- San Jose/Monterey
- Toland/Jerrold
- Circular/Congo

Power Outages:

- Approximately 97,000 customers without power
- San Bruno Jail; 1011 Turk Street; SFSU Custody Division and Field Ops Center on generator power
- Hospitals/Health Care Facilities on generator power-St. Francis; CPMC-Pacific Campus; CPMC-California Campus, various buildings; Maxine Hall Health Center
- Presidio NO power
- Many traffic signals out

Transportation and Road Closures:

- Montgomery BART and Muni stations closed due to power outages
- Golden Gate Ferry ran, but Vallejo, Oakland and Alameda were closed
- Great Highway

PROJECTS and ACTIVITIES:

- Currently working on H8 Per Diem operational procedures with ADC Jeff Myers, Mark Corso. Rob Neuneker and Jesus Mora.
- Working with ADC Jeff Myers, Mark Corso and Commissioner Ken Cleaveland of the 911 Provider Committee on 911 system and system analysis.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES:

EMS Operations:

- The EMS Division continues to work with the Mayor's workgroup discussing the issues surrounding EMS.
- Conducting H3L1 entry level screening and interviews along with EMSA packet reviews.

- Continues to work with Support Services and Capital Planning on the EMS
 Business Plan and space requirements for a new EMS Facility/Station 49 as part
 of the 2015 Health Department Bond. (Chief Lombardi, Mark Corso, Chief
 Myers)
- Ambulances: Leader Ambulance has delivered the first 10 of the new 19 ambulances. They were outfitted and were placed in service.

Special Events:

Planned and executed the New Year's Eve celebration response

— 41 transport units in the system, experienced 35-41 transports an hour per peak periods.

BFP/BFI:

Bureau of Fire Prevention:

- 1. BFP has a new Acting Fire Inspector, Marifi Esteves, who is now being trained on "annual" inspections.
- 2. Vision Zero SF
 - Pedestrian and bicycle safety projects continue to be accelerated through "daylighting" (eliminate parked vehicles at corners i.e., Tenderloin), traffic calming projects (including corner bulbs, narrowed travel lanes), re-directing traffic flow ("Waggle" routes), road paint
 - SFFD Fire Commission adoption of Vision Zero Resolution pending.
 - Resolution drafted urging the California Judicial Council to re-evaluate and increase fines for unsafe driving behaviors such as cell phone use, passing standing transit vehicles, failing to yield while turning/pedestrian right-of-way (Supervisor Tang, Kim)
- 3. Prop A Transportation Bond \$500 million
 - Approximately 16 SFMTA corridor projects to be funded over the next year.
 - Project accelerated and triaged to coincide with DPW work (Muni Forward Initiative)
 - Improve pedestrian safety, transit service, accessibility through sidewalk bulbouts, boarding islands, eliminating stops/light timing

- 4. SFMTA Van Ness Corridor Transit Improvement Project
 - 65% Intermediate Review Design Package received 12/22/14 review and comments due 01/09/15
 - Re-configuring of Van Ness Avenue from Market to Bay includes: dedicated transit in center lanes (similar to Third St.), corner bulb-outs, narrowed and reduced number of traffic lanes.
- 5. Treasure Island and Yerba Buena Island Redevelopment Project
 - Weekly meetings regarding infrastructure including SFFD vehicle access/ streetscape designs
 - Preliminary review and comments of Streetscape Master Plan Draft submitted by SFFD and reviewed with developer (comments due 01/09/15) with goal of City Sign-off on Final Plan 01/30/15
 - Low Pressure Water System and Recycled Water Master Plans received for initial review; comments due 01/23/15; meeting with PUC/CDD, DPW, SFFD tentatively scheduled 01/12/15.

Bureau of Fire Investigation:

- Five members of the Arson Task Force have successfully completed training in the use of the DOJ-California Law Enforcement Telecommunication System record database. This database provides a resource that enables Fire Investigators to conduct a thorough and complete investigation for all fire investigations. Only trained and screened law enforcement personnel are allowed Level II access on the CLETS terminal.
- There were 19 personal appearance subpoenas served and 49 requests for records fulfilled.

Port:

- January 23 25, Public Assembly Event SF Boat Show at Pier 48.
- January 28, Public Assembly Event Golden State Warriors at Pier 48.

Plan Check:

- For the Calendar Year 2014 FIRE Plan Check approved 12,953 permit applications, a 12.5% increase from calendar year 2013.
- As part of Mayor Lee's Executive Directive 13-01 and Department of Building Inspection's Information Sheet G-17, we are investigating construction standards that would help existing non-permitted residential units to become permitted in buildings throughout the City. Fire Plan Check also reviews numerous requests to construct new units to existing residential buildings.

SFO:

- SFO Fire Marshal's Office is developing a Fire Permits program. This program is in development—progressing as resources allow. Primary focus is tracking hazardous material use and storage.
- "Operation Safety Sweep" (a new program being launched at SFO) will include an ongoing systematic inspection of the International/Domestic Terminal Complex buildings. This program is in the early development stage. Prevention is working with SFO Risk Management to identify high risk hazards.
- Large capital improvement projects are progressing well. Air Traffic Control Tower/Integrated Facility Building is scheduled to open in May 2015. Terminal 3 East building expansion project is scheduled to be completed in November of 2015. Terminal 1/Boarding Area B planning phase has begun.
- SFO Fire Marshal's Office is exploring the opportunity of adding a "project funded" inspector position. This position would focus on the capital improvement projects while allowing the Fire Marshal's Office the ability to allocate greater resources to the Fire Permits program.

BUREAU OF COMMUNICATIONS:

- Finishing up Station 4 run card project.
- Testing new MDT's in the field.
- Testing new radios at Station 11.
